Unit 1: SECTIONALISM AND WAR	SS12.5.3, SS12.6.3, SS12.6.4	Students will explain the causes of sectionalism and compromises in the years leading up to the Civil War. Students will also identify the major battles, and the end of the Civil War.
Unit 2: GROWTH AND INNOVATION	SS12.3.3, SS12.6.3, SS12.6.4	Students will examine the goals and outcomes of Reconstruction, the outcomes of industrialization, and the causes and effects of western expansion.
